Tiago Rodrigues Presents the Festival d'Avignon

Tiago Rodrigues, new Director of the Festival d'Avignon, one of the most prominent performing arts festivals in Europe, will be at the Institut français to introduce the programme of its 77th edition. The presentation will be followed by a conversation between French and British artists featured in this edition, celebrating the upcoming festival's focus on the English language.



Art Matters with Tarek Lakhrissi

Poet and artist **Tarek Lakhrissi** will explore the themes of desire, queer poetic and empowerment through a reading followed by a conversation with curator **Lynton Talbot**, as part of Beyond Words Festival. The discussion will delve into the relation between his writing and visual arts practice, and his use of language as a tool for resistance and self-defence.

Cinema of Resistance with Zineb Sedira

Resonating with Zineb Sedira's 2022 Venice Biennale show, this programme, presented as part of the SAFAR Film Festival, sheds light on the relationship between cinema, anticolonial activism in Algeria and collective memory. It features Sedira's short film *mise-en-scène* (2019), William Klein's cult documentary *Le Festival Panafricain d'Alger* (1969), and Ennio Lorenzini's film *Les Mains libres* (1965). The screenings will be followed by a Q&A session with **Zineb Sedira** and film curator and critic **Róisín Tapponi**.

The season also brings an enlightening film on **Patricia Highsmith**, *Loving Highsmith*, as well as Nobel Prizewinner **Annie Ernaux**'s directorial debut, **The Super 8 Years**.



One Fine Morning

Writer-director **Mia Hansen-Løve** (*Things to Come*) offers a profoundly moving portrayal of love, loss and contemporary wornanhood, which features a career-defining performance from **Léa Seydoux**. A young widow juggles her job as a translator with caring both for her young daughter and her elderly father. Her life becomes more complicated when she embarks on a passionate affair with an old friend in an unhappy marriage...

Focus on Sergei Loznitsa

Ciné Lumière joins forces with Pushkin House to celebrate the multifaceted oeuvre of Ukrainian director Sergei Loznitsa. The programme will feature the UK premiere of his latest film, The Kiev Trial as well as Babi Yar. Context – two documentaries exploring the prelude and aftermath of the World War II massacre of nearly 34,000 Jews in Kiev. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with the director.

During the Refugee Week, we'll present the London premiere of Lionel Baier's latest political comedy, **Continental Drift**, featuring the charismatic **Isabelle Carré** and **Théodore Pellerin**. A film that offers lightness on the theme of refugees while making us think of all the issues at stake.
